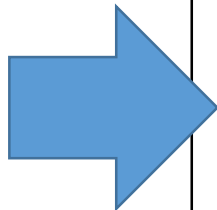

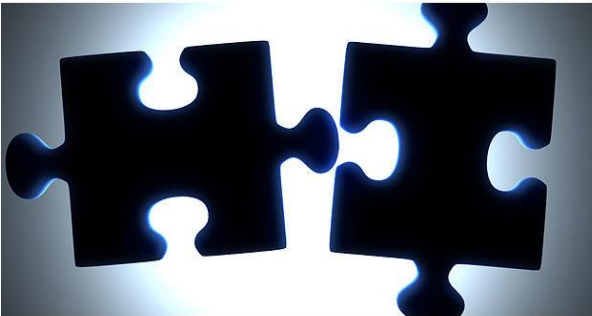

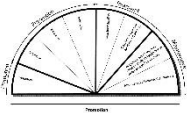
What Are We Seeing?

Collective work to identify new sources of data and to access data that is not easily available



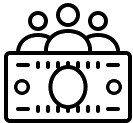
Planning across the full continuum of care



A focus on workforce needs & gaps



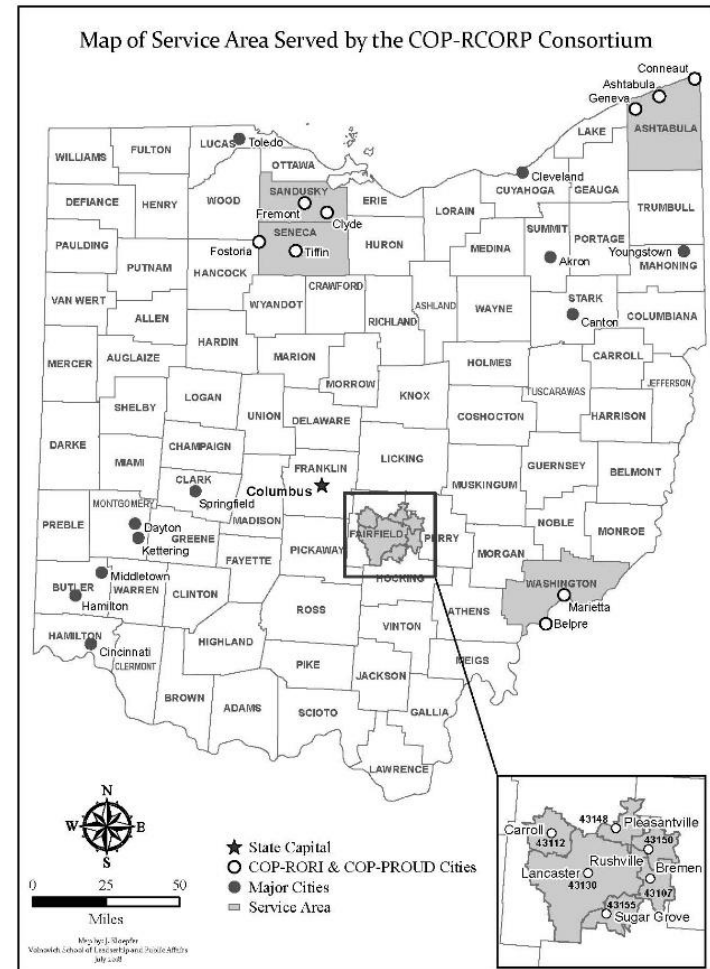
Work to identify shared priorities and shared strategies

Innovating from Planning to Implementation: HRSA RCORP-I

Guiding Principles:

- Examine “right-sized” funding as a sustainable way forward
- Propose a braided funding approach
- Commit to funding equity across communities
- Balance backbone support with sufficient community resources



RCORP-I Proposed COP-RCORP (Combined) Budget

PIRE (Indirect Costs based on FNICRA)	\$ 175,675	8.78%
